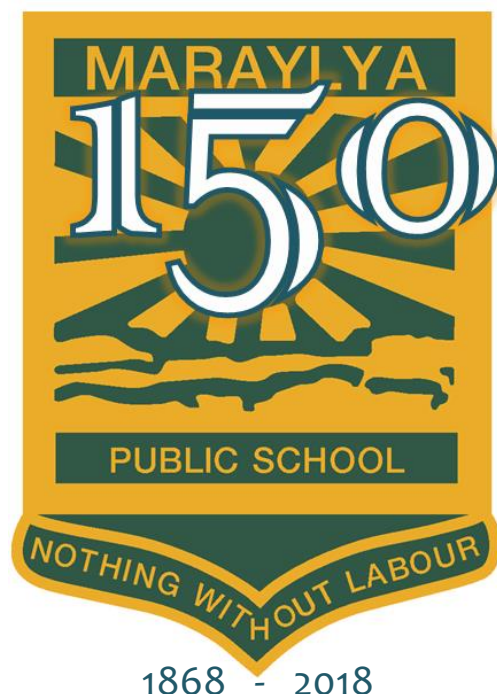

## Principal's Message

Last week we celebrated our very first 'MAY8' DAY at Maraylya Public School.

This day was marked as a special day to focus on how we can be a good mate to our fellow school mates. The day took a 'random act of kindness' approach, whereby students pulled a class mate's name out of a hat and had to think of something kind to do for that person during the day or rest of the week. # Busways School Opal Tap Campaign Term 2

This term will see Busways Inspectors checking to ensure students are using their Opal cards when boarding the school bus. Students that do not present a valid Opal card will be asked to pay a fare. Failure to produce a valid Opal card or bus fare will result in the Inspector recording the student's name.

Below is an example of the form our Inspectors will use.

After the school inspection the names that were recorded will be emailed to the school, with a request for the school to follow-up with the students and parents/guardians concerned.

All students need to produce a •School Opal card •Child/Youth Opal card •Or pay a fare to travel on our buses.

An Opal card is important because it is used to determine demand for bus services. If students don't have an Opal card to tap on and off the service will appear underutilised and may be considered for cancellation based on low passenger numbers.

### School Fees and Contributions

Just a reminder that contributions and school fees for specific programs will need to be paid at the start of the term i.e. Reading Eggs, Ty Fitness, Athletics etc.

Ty fitness has been sought and supported by parents as a way to help our students raise not only their fitness levels but levels of resilience and sportsmanship. The school partially subsidises Ty Fitness to help make it more affordable for families. Athletics and reading eggs are significantly cheaper using the Small Schools Cluster agreement – an approximate saving of \$60 off the normal costs of these resources.

### Stewart House

Stewart House run programs to help students in need have a break from home and continue their schooling at the beach. All Stewart House donation envelopes have now been posted.

Stewart House Clothing Appeal bags have been sent out. Please bring bags back into school for the appeal **only on the 13<sup>th</sup> June for pick up on the 14<sup>th</sup> June**. Thank you for your help in this arrangement as the school cannot store the large amount of clothing bags for the next few weeks.

### Student Leave

Each year we remind our families of the processes around student leave. This leave may involve a late arrival due to unforeseeable circumstances or an early departure from school for an unavoidable reason or even a full day away from school due to illness or specialist medical appointments.

The school will be more closely monitoring the late arrivals, early departures and full day absences of all students in 2018 due to periodic increases in partial and full absenteeism.

As stated many times before, it is the school's and Department of Education's expectation that students will be present at school every school day. When this is not possible due to illness or some other worthy reason, notification explaining the absence must be supplied to school. Emails to the principal for day to day absences are no longer accepted due to the difficulty in monitoring this within an already heavily loaded inbox. Please phone the school after 8.15am or send a note to school on the child's return to school. If a child is arriving late or departing early for an appointment, we request that documentation regarding the nature of the appointment be supplied. **Sporting training is not a valid reason for partial absence and should always be scheduled for outside of school hours.**

Remember, 95% attendance sounds respectable however it equates to 10 days off school or two full school weeks.

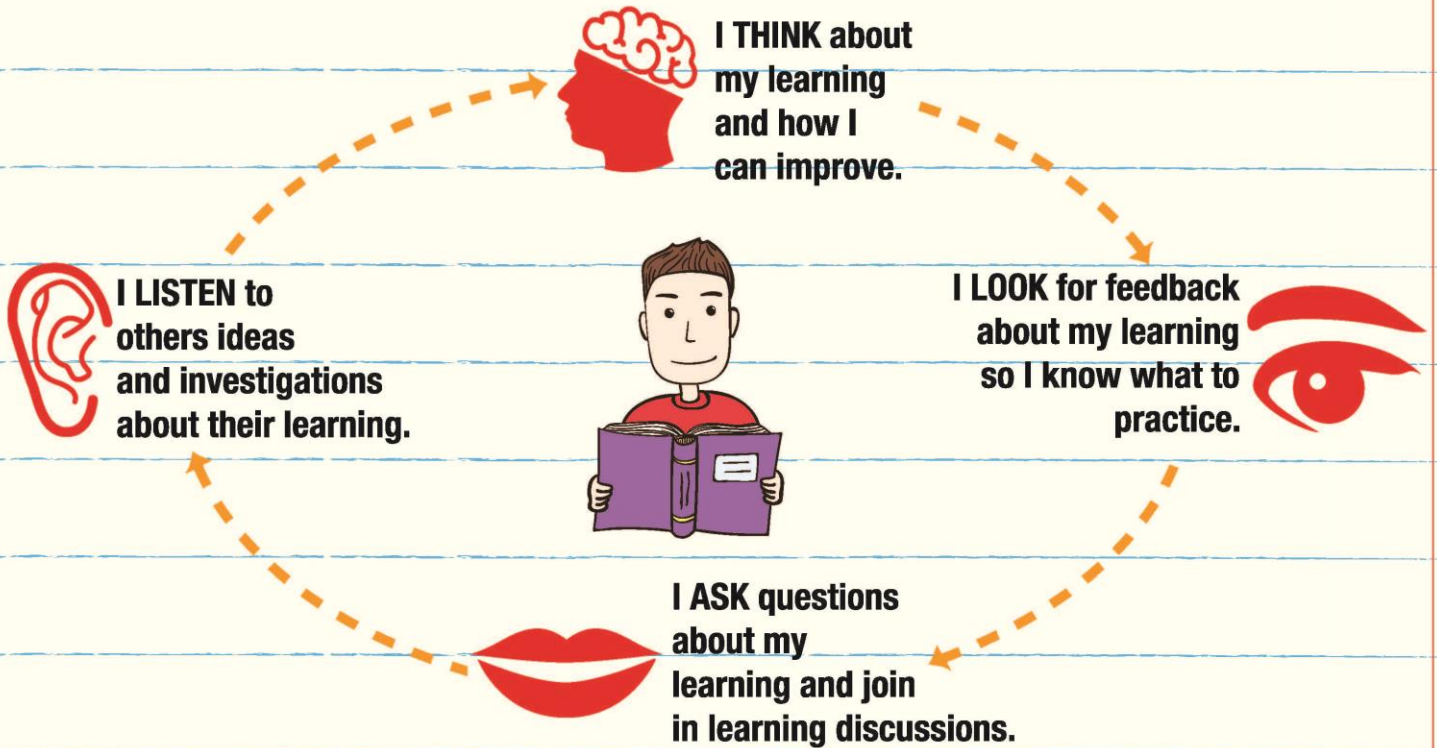
**If a student is late for school they must be accompanied to the office by the adult bringing them to school. Parents are required to provide a valid reason for their child's late arrival in the interests of the child's wellbeing.**

While we are a school who generally enjoys regular student attendance, we are already seeing an improvement in attendance – thanks to our families for their help in ensuring students are at school and learning.

## RED Reading Folders

In K-2, our R.E.D reading folders are well under way.

All students have been provided with a red folder – which is separate to a homework folder.




Students can bring in their folder as many days a week as they choose... it's up to you – how much do you want to read?

Teachers will then ask students to read the book they have been practicing, and decide if this book needs a little more practice or can be swapped.

Students have a 'punch' card and will earn a Star Award once their card has been filled.

Well done to all those students who have already brought in their red reading folders this year, and have their homereading under way.

If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 school days, and Student C will have read for 3.

## Want to be a better reader? Simply read.



**Wellbeing and PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning)** our students have continued to maintain a positive atmosphere in the playground. Staff are continuing to follow-up on the lessons previously taught in 2017, asking students to think about what safety, respect and responsibility looks like in particular areas.

### Current PBL focus – ‘Play Equipment’

Students are taught / reminded of the rules around correct behaviour in the play equipment area where students are involved in active play.

They are expected to take turns and not run in this area.

Our students are very good at following the rules here – always making sure they have supervision by asking permission to go on the equipment. Great work kids!

We recognise that there will always be small issues amongst students. Please encourage your child to talk to their teacher or principal if they have any concerns in regards to social interactions in the school.

If this is not appropriate, please make contact with the school as soon as possible so smaller issues can be attended to before becoming bigger. Staff take great time and care in working to ensure that students feel happy and secure at school.

## **Vegetables**

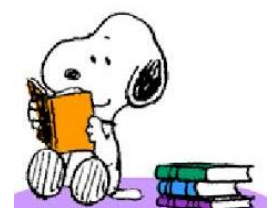

## CLASS NEWS



In Maths, Kindy have been learning their 'Friends of 10.' We read the story *One is a Snail, Ten is a Crab* and counted the animals' feet. We are learning different combinations of animal feet to put together to make 10. It is difficult to see in the photos, but Aiden and Ali have come up with lots of different ways to make 10. For example, insect (6 legs) + a dog (4 legs) = 10. And, a spider (8 legs) + a person (2 legs) = 10.



In English this term, we are reading books around the theme "Being Happy with Yourself." We've read *Pig the Pug* and *Thelma the Unicorn*, both by Aaron Blabey. We are learning that writing has different purposes, and have been labelling pictures and writing letters. In Sport, we are learning gymnastic skills. Students practise isolating and strengthening their muscles, developing core strength particularly for balancing, jumping and rolling... all in fun, game based activities.

### 1/2

This fortnight in Maths we are concentrating on addition and subtractions using number lines and 100 charts, splitting double numbers into 10s and 1s and jumping by 10s rather than counting each one. Year 1 is focusing on starting from the larger number and counting on from that number rather than starting by putting up fingers and then counting on. A tricky concept for some! History is proving very interesting. Children have been bringing in some interesting historical artefacts to discuss and display. We are currently looking at what are artefacts and what they can tell us about the past. Great discussion was had about an object from Mr Gaffey which turned out to be a portable clothes line! Speeches this Term are Recounts, telling us about events which have already happened. Our first speeches involving retelling a fairy tale are going well. Some children are including wonderful expression into their story telling. If you did not get the Public Speaking information sheet please let me know.

2/3

A very big welcome back to Term 2! 2/3 were very excited sharing stories of their holidays with peers and Mrs Carney, as well as catching up with all their friends. We started off the term by reviewing what it means to have a Growth Mindset or a Fixed Mindset, and we revised some “positive self-talk” to help us persevere this term when 2/3 face some challenges (and we all know that challenges help us grow!). This term 2/3 will be looking at imaginary texts in Writing and we will be building our skills in Narrative writing. We are learning to give feedback (using our special feedback cards) to our peers about their writing to set goals for each other to improve. 2/3 will continue literature circle roles when reading group novels as well as the school magazines. In Maths we are exploring 2, 3 and 4 digit numbers and we are ordering and comparing them using greater than or less than symbols. 2/3 are also mastering counting by 10s off the decade – ask anyone in 2/3, they will be happy to show you!

4

Over the past fortnight Year 4 have been developing their persuasive writing skills. We have been learning about sizzling starts and how they can be used to persuade an audience. Currently we are focusing on creating interesting paragraphs. We are using peer feedback to ensure that we have met the success criteria and to also improve our work based on the feedback received.

In visual arts, we have been learning about Pablo Picasso, viewing his work and creating Picasso inspired artworks. This week’s artwork was inspired by winter and incorporated blue tones that we also used with our Picasso works.





5/6

We have been working well with our buddies. This teaches us responsibility, organization, communication skills and patience!

They are all doing brilliantly!



As part of our assignment work, we had to design a game for other sto play.

We played Kurt's game at Ty Fitness. He was pretty happy that we all enjoyed it so much.



In Literature Circles, the Year 6 students discussed at length the meaning and themes behind one of the texts, 'The Drought Maker'.

One group created an open ended question to fuel discussion, which it did. The conversation spilled over to the other group who could not find an answer to the question.

Without a satisfactory answer provided by the text, they sent an email off to the author to see if they could have their curiosity satisfied.

We will report back if they were successful.

## **P & C News - May**

### **Maraylya Public School - Sesquicentenary**

November 2018 marks 150 years of Maraylya Public School. The date has been set to Friday 2nd November, 2018. Along with the day's format an afternoon activity will be included which is intended to extend after school hours to allow those who work to take part in the celebrations.

### **Grants**

In December the P and C were notified that we were successful in obtaining a partial grant of \$26,000 by the Community Building Partnership. The application was signed and sent off for Assets approval to extend the existing COLA area by 4 metres. The seating will be replaced to become portable. Existing seating will be utilised in other areas of the school grounds.
