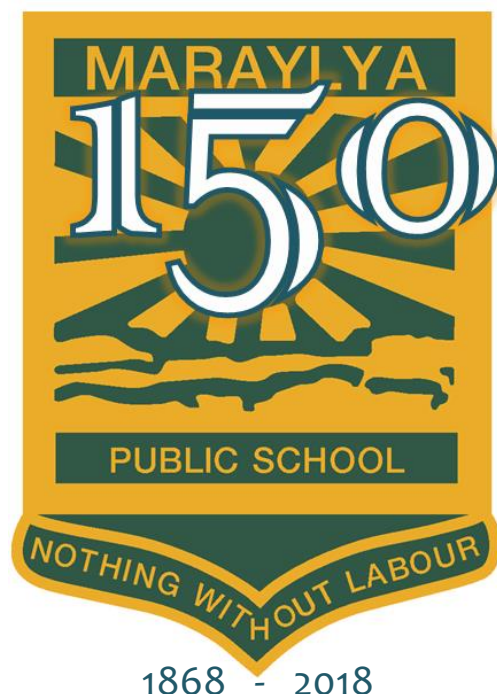

Within library lessons this term, students have access to tasks that are science and technology based and linked to the shortlisted texts. A worthwhile initiative – thanks to Mrs Sadler for her work in bringing these lessons to fruition.

Our computer room is becoming more closely linked to the work completed in the library. Last year Mrs Pearson began using this space as part of a more linked approach to achieve the library outcomes using available technologies. With last week's installation of a white board for teaching using the smart board projector, we envisage this space used more frequently.

Further plans are afoot to replace the benches in this room for flexible ease of use and accommodate further technology for use with our students.

Busways School Opal Tap Campaign Term 2

This term will see Busways Inspectors checking to ensure students are using their Opal cards when boarding the school bus. Students that do not present a valid Opal card will be asked to pay a fare. Failure to produce a valid Opal card or bus fare will result in the Inspector recording the student's name.

After the school inspection the names that were recorded will be emailed to the school, with a request for the school to follow-up with the students and parents/guardians concerned.

All students need to produce a •School Opal card •Child/Youth Opal card •Or pay a fare to travel on our buses.

An Opal card is important because it is used to determine demand for bus services. If students don't have an Opal card to tap on and off the service will appear underutilised and may be considered for cancellation based on low passenger numbers.

Stewart House Clothing Appeal bags have been sent out. Please bring bags back into school for the appeal **only on the 13th June for pick up on the 14th June**. Thank you for your help in this arrangement as the school cannot store the large amount of clothing bags for the next few weeks.

Student Leave

Each year we remind our families of the processes around student leave. This leave may involve a late arrival due to unforeseeable circumstances or an early departure from school for an unavoidable reason or even a full day away from school due to illness or specialist medical appointments.

The school will be more closely monitoring the late arrivals, early departures and full day absences of all students in 2018 due to periodic increases in partial and full absenteeism.

As stated many times before, it is the school's and Department of Education's expectation that students will be present at school every school day. When this is not possible due to illness or some other worthy reason, notification explaining the absence must be supplied to school. Emails to the principal for day to day absences are no longer accepted due to the difficulty in monitoring this within an already heavily loaded inbox. Please phone the school after 8.15am or send a note to school on the child's return to school. If a child is arriving late or departing early for an appointment, we request that documentation regarding the nature of the appointment be supplied. **Sporting training is not a valid reason for partial absence and should always be scheduled for outside of school hours.**

Remember, 95% attendance sounds respectable however it equates to 10 days off school or two full school weeks.

If a student is late for school they must be accompanied to the office by the adult bringing them to school. Parents are required to provide a valid reason for their child's late arrival in the interests of the child's wellbeing.

While we are a school who generally enjoys regular student attendance, we are already seeing an improvement in attendance – thanks to our families for their help in ensuring students are at school and learning.

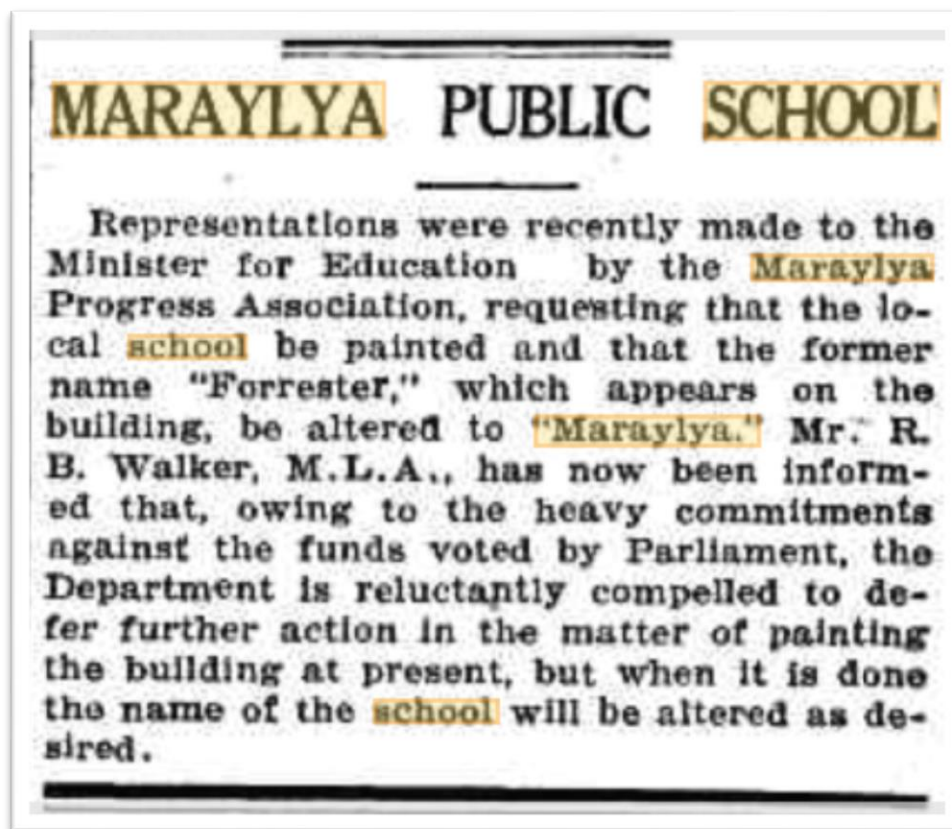
What Does a Learner Do?

1. Identifies the Learning Goal.
2. Makes a plan to achieve the goal.
3. Carries out the plan using multiple strategies and deliberate practice.
4. Observes his/her progress, efforts and thoughts during the process--makes changes when needed to learn well.
5. Uses "success criteria" to determine when the goal is met.

RED Reading Folders

In K-2, our R.E.D reading folders are well under way.

All students have been provided with a red folder – which is separate to a homework folder.




Students can bring in their folder as many days a week as they choose... it's up to you – how much do you want to read?

Teachers will then ask students to read the book they have been practicing, and decide if this book needs a little more practice or can be swapped.

Students have a 'punch' card and will earn a Star Award once their card has been filled.

Well done to all those students who have already brought in their red reading folders this year, and have their homereading under way.

Why read 20 minutes at home?

If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 school days, and Student C will have read for 3.

Wellbeing and PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning) our students have continued to maintain a positive atmosphere in the playground. Staff are continuing to follow-up on the lessons previously taught in 2017, asking students to think about what safety, respect and responsibility looks like in particular areas.

Current PBL focus – ‘Sports Shed’

Students are taught / reminded of the rules around correct behaviour in the sports shed area where students are involved in borrowing equipment to use at lunch times.

They are expected to take care of the equipment borrowed and return it when finished. Their names are recorded in the book by the sports house captains.

Our students are very good at returning their equipment at the end of lunch and our captains and vice captains who oversee the shed at lunch are excellent at keeping the shed organised well run. Great work kids!

We recognise that there will always be small issues amongst students. Please encourage your child to talk to their teacher or principal if they have any concerns in regards to social interactions in the school.

If this is not appropriate, please make contact with the school as soon as possible so smaller issues can be attended to before becoming bigger. Staff take great time and care in working to ensure that students feel happy and secure at school.

CLASS NEWS

Kindgerarten News

In Maths we have been sorting and classifying objects. We used different objects in our classroom and worked out how we could classify them. Sienna and Drew classified their blocks by colour. Mackenzie sorted her objects by the number of holes in the buttons. Ava and Ali sorted by colour. Sophia and Cooper classified by colour, and later by letter. Holly and Emilia classified their objects by shape. Lily and Aiden sorted their buttons according to size (small, medium and large). Rhys sorted his buttons by colour and then by the number in each colour group.

Last week we read "Pig the Pug" by Aaron Blabey. We wrote an information report about dogs and then typed these into a Word document. We learnt SO MUCH!!! We really gave our brains a workout!

A very big welcome to our new student, Dantae! All the girls and boys have been very welcoming, we hope that Dantae feels like a part of the Maraylya 'family' soon!



Year 1/2 News

In Maths we are looking at sharing fairly. We are dividing large numbers of items into smaller groups, and discovering if we end up with even groups or not. You could help at home by asking your child to share out items such as biscuits, grapes or treats amongst the family. We are also looking at the volume of things, comparing the capacity of bottles and containers by measuring using one small cup and water or rice to measure fairly. In Science we have discovered that worms have no legs, and no eyes! They eat the dirt and are good for plants and the soil. They even have a 'saddle'. We are investigating 'What are worms, are they insects?' We are completing our focus on writing Recounts with the children enjoying writing an imaginary recount of an 'interesting' news item they 'brought' to school. Next week we will start writing Narratives. Historical artefacts are still coming in with some interesting background stories attached. It would be good to have some old kitchen utensils such as a hand mixer or coffee grinder if anyone still has some.

Year 2/3 News

2/3 have been learning skills to improve their narrative writing in English. This week, we have been learning the skill of "Show, don't tell". By showing, we are painting a picture in the reader's mind, rather than just telling the reader. Here are some "Show Don't Tell" examples from 2/3:

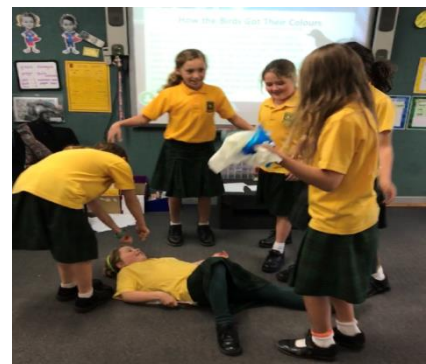
The cat was hungry and the goldfish was scared.

In History, year 3 have been learning about the original inhabitants of Australia, the Aboriginal people. We have explored the many Aboriginal nations around Australia and found the one Maraylya is in – Darug Nation. We also learned some of the Darug Nation's language, asking each other "Hi, How are you?" (Ask a year 3 person to translate for you!). We listened to and read a few Dreamtime stories and in groups, year 3 had to act them out! It was an afternoon of drama fun!



Year 4 News

During CAPA afternoons on Monday students who are not at dance are working with 5/6 students in an art program called – An introduction to Aboriginal Art. So far the students have learnt about sand art which indigenous people used to tell stories or leave messages in the sand or dirt. We had a go ourselves using indigenous symbols to create our own stories which the students shared with one another outside in the playground. Next week we will be learning about bark paintings.



Year 5/6 News

Ty's design a game competition and assignment has been very successful in engaging students in fitness sessions, not to mention students having to communicate the rules in written and verbal methods.

This week Megan and Sarah had their games chosen to be played by the class to the enjoyment of all involved.

Such a worthwhile initiative for both fitness and creative English skills!
